

Our approach gives clients the **best opportunity for recovery** with:

- The power of community: Our professional, interdisciplinary teams and programs leverage the invaluable power of peer and community support systems, including 12-step programs, to provide clients with the best opportunity for recovery.
- A client-focused approach: As a not-for-profit organization, we always
 prioritize the delivery of safe, quality care. We invest every dollar we receive
 into providing treatment and supporting recovery.
- Empathy and compassion: Our team members bring unparalleled compassion and empathy to their roles, as they draw from their own lived experience with addiction and long-term recovery, as well as their professional training.





Renascent operates three inpatient addiction treatment centres – two in Toronto and one in Durham Region, providing a safe, caring and home-like experience for our clients. We provide around-the-clock counselling and support from our professional team members with specialized addiction training, and lived experience of addiction and long-term recovery. Our centres and programs are gender-specific, and we work with non-binary and trans individuals in a person-centred way, ensuring the specific needs of all clients are met.

Grounded in a holistic approach to recovery, Renascent's programs offer evidence-based treatment approaches, medical care, and 12-step facilitation. Music, yoga, mindfulness and art are some of the activities that are integrated into the experience to enhance the clients' living experience and recovery at our inpatient facilities.

Government funding does not cover the full cost of inpatient treatment. Annual donations ensure Renascent continues to deliver quality residential addition treatment to Ontarians through its government-supported program, with no cost to the individual.



Renascent recognizes drug and alcohol addiction as a family disease and we see family members as clients in their own right. We offer help to all affected by someone else's addiction, whether or not the person experiencing addiction is receiving treatment themselves.

Our Essential Family Care Program is tailored to meet the distinct needs of people impacted by a loved one's drinking or drug use. We help family members and loved ones learn how addiction affects them and help them get the tools to set boundaries, and address enabling and codependent behaviours, so they too can begin their own recovery. The program includes group and one-to-one counselling with our team of addiction experts, and continued aftercare.

Addiction impacts children too and our Children's Program is designed to help children ages 7-13 develop practical tools for self-care and learn the skills to protect themselves from the effects of addiction. This program is open to all regardless of Renascent affiliation and it includes intensive programming, such as group and one-to-one counselling with our team of addiction experts, and continued aftercare.

Over the course of the program, kids learn that it is okay to hate the disease but love their parents. They learn practical tools to support self-care, communication, and the expression of emotions that may have been stifled. They learn that they are not alone and that other kids and families share their experience. The treatment program is powerful, yet allows kids to be kids. Play, arts, and games help kids process addiction and recovery as a personal and family experience, in an age-appropriate way.

Renascent does not receive government funding for its Children's Program. Your donations ensure that children are able to access high-quality programs through bursaries.



Any big life change takes time and practice, and recovery from addiction is no different. Our Continuing Care Program provides 20 weeks of additional support to help protect recovery during the critical first few months after intensive addiction treatment to enable long-term recovery.

Our Continuing Care Program is available to anyone who has completed inpatient and outpatient treatment at Renascent, or any addiction treatment provider. Through the program, clients attend weekly sessions which include one-on-one counselling, as well as group counselling; clients receive intensive relapse prevention education; and structured content and assignments.

Our Alumni Care Program provides ongoing support to help sustain long-term recovery and offers workshops, social events and much more to keep Alumni engaged in their recovery journey.

Renascent does not receive government funding for its Alumni Care Program or its Continuing Care Program for clients completing inpatient treatment. Your donations ensure that individuals are able to access quality ongoing treatment and support after intensive inpatient treatment through bursaries.



As an evidence-based organization, it is important for us to continually analyze the quality of our care and the impact of our services to ensure that we are consistently delivering exceptional care through our programs. Renascent partners with university and hospital-based research groups to conduct outcome studies and program evaluations. Strong data support and analytics capabilities within Renascent are essential to enabling ongoing research and program evaluation.



Lindsey's Story


Lindsey had been using heroin and fentanyl heavily for almost 10 years before she came into treatment at Renascent's Graham Munro Treatment Centre. Her dad died suddenly when she was 18 and his passing propelled Lindsey into a downward spiral. She began using more and more to cope with her traumas.

After multiple overdoses, Lindsey finally sought help at Renascent. Addiction is a cunning disease and even after her first stay at Renascent, Lindsey struggled. She was diagnosed with bipolar disorder and her uncle – who was a father figure – died while she was in treatment.

She relapsed and we were there to provide support when Lindsey returned to treatment. Our staff provided expert clinical care to treat Lindsey's addiction and helped her manage her mental health issues. After treatment, through our Continuing Care and Alumni Programs, Lindsey was able to stay connected to a strong recovery community and continue expanding upon the skills, tools and resources she gained in treatment.

"I've been sober now for over five years and my life is very different. Today, I am engaged and I have a strong relationship with my family. I can hold my head with confidence; I can look someone in their eyes. I am far more independent as well, with my own place and money," said Lindsey.

Kristy's Story

When Kristy Stamp's husband began treatment at Renascent for addiction and mental health issues, she knew she too was in need of help. As the spouse of someone experiencing addiction, Kristy wanted to begin her own journey toward recovery and receive support.

Renascent's Essential Family Care Program was everything that Kristy needed. "The program helped me navigate the changes and obstacles I continue to face along my husband's recovery journey," said Kristy. "Feelings of support and connection were definitely made during the weekly meetings, and the information provided was extremely thorough and conducive to what I needed to learn and apply to my own recovery."

It's been a long road for Kristy and Tiberio, who are also the parents of a three year old. Over the years, Tiberio's cocaine, alcohol and marijuana use increased dramatically and while he tried not to use around Kristy, the tell-tale signs of addiction were there. It was after being hospitalized, that Tiberio decided to seek help.

Today, Kristy and her husband continue to work toward long-term recovery together and she is proud of the progress they've both made.

"The Essential Family Care Program built me up to be stronger in my decision making, up holding my boundaries and consequences, and helping me gain the courage to know that I am in control of my life and my environments and that I can choose to be with Tiberio but not the addiction," says Kristy, who has also noted very positive changes in her husband. "There are moments when I recognize his attention to me and to our family. I've seen huge changes in the level of courtesy and consideration he displays. He is definitely more present now and I trust him much more."
